

Scenario:

Mitch Malone presents to the doctor's office with an "annoying hard area on the bottom of his foot". When he applies pressure to the area it hurts. His biggest concern is that "it's throwing off his basketball game". His diagnosis is a plantar wart. The doctor prescribes a salicylic acid solution to be compounded by his pharmacist, and explains to Mitch that the treatment may take months to totally resolve his problem. His physician also explains that warts are viruses and usually are self-limiting, and that the salicylic acid treatments will help to expedite the removal of the wart. Dr. Kolas' final recommendation is that Mitch uses a pumice stone once a week, to help remove the affected skin.
